

## **Cessnock City Council Local Control Plan for Groundsel Bush (*Baccharis halimifolia*)**

### 1. Purpose of this plan:

To specify the measures that a landholder must implement to ensure that his/her/their General Biosecurity Duty is discharged in relation to Groundsel Bush. **Any person (eg the owner or occupier of land) dealing with Groundsel Bush must comply with their General Biosecurity Duty (GBD).**

### 2. Legal status:

The management of invasive weeds in NSW is governed by the Biosecurity Act 2015. The Local Control Authority (Cessnock City Council) is responsible for ensuring the prevention, elimination, minimization and management of the biosecurity risk posed or likely to be posed by invasive weeds. It is also responsible for the development, implementation, coordination and review of invasive weed control programs within its area of jurisdiction.

### 3. Legislative requirements under the Biosecurity Act 2015 – General Biosecurity Duty (GBD):

Any person who deals with biosecurity matter or a carrier and who knows, or ought reasonably to know, the biosecurity risk posed or likely to be posed by the biosecurity matter, carrier or dealing has a biosecurity duty to ensure that so far as is reasonably practicable, the biosecurity risk is prevented, eliminated or minimized.

### 4. What does “reasonably practicable” mean?

The term is set out in the Biosecurity Act 2015 as – reasonably practicable, in relation to the prevention, elimination or minimization of a biosecurity risk, means that which is, or was at a particular time, reasonably able to be done, taking into account and weighing up all reasonable matters - see Biosecurity Act 2015, Section 16 for details.

### 5. Prescribed Control Measures to ensure compliance with the Biosecurity Act 2015:

- **General Biosecurity Duty:**
  - All plants are regulated with a general biosecurity duty to prevent, eliminate or minimize any biosecurity risk they may pose. Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimized, so far as is reasonably practicable.
- **Landholders obligations:**
  - The plant must be fully and continuously suppressed and destroyed.
- **Regional Recommended Measure:**
  - Land Area 1 (core infestation within Newcastle, Greater Taree and Lake Macquarie.): Land managers should mitigate the risk of new weeds being introduced to their land.
  - Land Area 2 (Rest of region): The plant should be eradicated from the land and the land kept free of the plant. Notify the Local Control Authority if found. The plant should not be bought, sold, grown, carried or released into the environment.
