Cumberland Street, Cessnock – Pedestrian Refuge

The Project

This is a sub-project of the Cessnock Civic Precinct Revitalisation Program. The project includes installation of pedestrian refuge, kerb narrowing blisters, associated footpath connection pram ramps and installation of signs and line markings.



Location

The planned works are located on Cumberland Street, Cessnock between Edward Street and Yango Street.



Design

Design of the new pedestrian refuge will

- Separate oncoming vehicles taking the curve and assist pedestrians crossing the road.
- Create a safer road environment.



Safety

The immediate area has been speed limited to 40km/h due to the proximity of works to the road. Traffic cones and bollards may be used to separate traffic from the work area.



Funding

This project is funded by the National Stronger Region Fund (NSRF) as part of cessnock CBD Revitalisation Project. Improving walking paths from the CBD to Bridges Hill park.



Timeline

Preliminary design - completed.
Approval - completed.
Construction- March 2019.
