Just 120 kilometres north of Sydney and 40 kilometres west of Newcastle, the Cessnock LGA covers 1,966 square kilometres within the beautiful Hunter Valley NSW.

Our region is home to close to 59,101 residents and the towns and villages within it are sustained by a diverse business environment with a backdrop of our famous wine and tourism industry.

The Hunter Valley is Australia's oldest wine producing region with around 4,500 acres under vine and the wine tourism industry is worth an estimated \$521 million. Close to major roads, including the M1 and Hunter Expressway, Cessnock is well situated for access into the Port of Newcastle and the Newcastle Airport.

Cessnock's natural environment has large expanses of untouched natural scenery bounded by National Parks and State Forests. The rural landscape is dominant, with uninterrupted grazing and pastoral lands. We're home to many fine heritage structures and have an emerging cultural precinct, with the Cessnock Performing Arts Centre being centrally located.

Cessnock City is an area of great social, cultural and spiritual importance to the people of the Wonnarua Nation and neighbouring Nations of Awabakal and Darkinjung, and within the LGA boundaries there are many significant Aboriginal sites.

We're a vibrant and growing region and always welcome new residents with a friendly smile.

The Council may adopt these proposals, amend the proposals, determine a completely different course of action, or it may decline to pursue any course of action.

The decision of the Council becomes a resolution and is recorded in the Council Minutes, Readers are referred to this separate document. The Council Business Paper and the Council Minutes are linked by the common Item Numbers and Titles. Audio recordings of Council meetings are also made available on Council's website.

Business Papers are available for inspection at Council's Admin Building and Libraries on the Friday afternoon before the meeting and published on Council's website.

PLANNING ON BUILDING?

If you're planning to carry out building and development works within the Cessnock LGA, you will generally need consent from Council before you begin.

There are certain types of development that don't require consent and these works are referred to as 'exempt' development. It's best to check with Council though, as the criteria for this can be found in a range of development controls and fines can apply if you don't comply.

There is lots of useful information on Council's website, including an overview of the development approval process.

WHAT CAN I DO WITH MY LAND?

Depending on what you'd like to do, changing the use of your land may require a change in the zone that applies to the land. This will depend on whether the proposed use is permissible or prohibited under the zone.

Decisions about development in the Cessnock LGA is influenced by state and local planning legislation, strategies and policies.

If you have any questions, Council's Strategic Land Use Planners are available to answer enquiries concerning land use permissibility and strategic planning matters.


