#### RANGER PATROLS AT SCHOOL ZONES

Councillor Parsons asked what the policy is with regard to the visibility of Rangers when they are observing School Drop off zones and do they only observe this particular area and not people who are illegally parking.

Director Planning and Environment answered that it is the practice and instruction to Rangers that they should be visible, especially where they stand, which usually acts as a deterrent to people who are parking in the no stopping zones. Notwithstanding, depending upon how many Rangers we have at a particular school, we have got five between the whole area, if there is more than one certainly if one is visible in one area, one can certainly look at other parking offences at the one time. Where there is only one, they have to prioritise the no stopping zones.
