MAYORAL MINUTE No. MM5/2023

SUBJECT: BELLBIRD MINE DISASTER 100TH ANNIVERSARY

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That Council notes that on 1 September 1923, 21 local miners perished as a result of a fire at Bellbird Colliery.
- 2. That Council notes on 1 September 2023 there will be a memorial service commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the Bellbird Mine Disaster held at Bellbird Miners Memorial Park, at the corner of Wollombi Road and Kendall Street, Bellbird commencing at 11am.
- 3. That Council notes various commemorative events are planned by Cessnock Council for the Bellbird disaster centenary.
- 4. That the General Manager investigate the option of naming new streets in the Bellbird area after the 21 miners that lost their lives.

REPORT/PROPOSAL

In the Bellbird Colliery explosion that occurred on 1st September 1923 explosions and fires underground killed 20 men and their horses, another man died in the rescue attempt bringing the death toll of the disaster to 21.

In 1923 the Bellbird colliery employed 538 men, 369 of whom worked underground. At 1:00pm on 1 September 1923, 20 men of the mine's afternoon shift entered the colliery to commence their day's work. 3 Deputies from the day shift were also in the mine, undertaking inspections of the working places as part of the shift handover. At about 1:30pm, having finished their inspection's, the three gathered near No. 4 West flat at the main haulage way where they greeted the afternoon shift Deputy who proceeded into the mine. As the 3 began to walk out the afternoon Deputy ran back calling "Come quick, it's fire!"

The loss of life had a devastating effect on the town of Cessnock the funerals of the victims were held on one day all 15 caskets proceeded to the cemetery in one procession. 25,000 people lined the streets to pay their respects to the deceased and to their families.

On Friday 1 September 2023 will be the 100th year anniversary of the Bellbird Mine Disaster and Coalfields Local History Association has organised a memorial service to commemorate the 100th anniversary. The memorial service will be held at the Bellbird Miners Memorial Park, at the corner of Wollombi Road and Kendall Street, Bellbird commencing at 11am.
