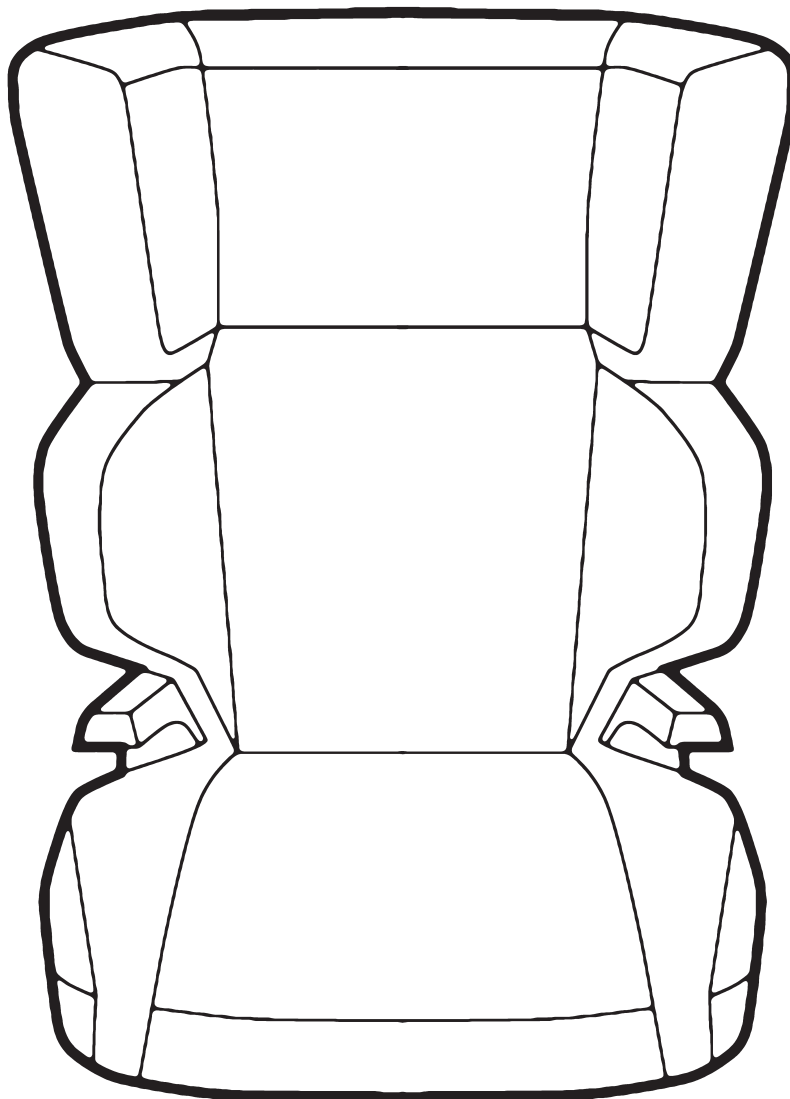


# Always buckle up safely

# For families

Adults are always responsible for the safety of the young children in their lives.

Keep children safe by ensuring:

- They are properly buckled up in the right seat for their age and size.

Children aged four to at least seven years must be buckled up in either a forward-facing child car seat or a booster seat on every journey.

It is also recommended that children seven years and over stay in their booster seat until they outgrow them, or until they are big enough to use a seatbelt.

- Child car seats and booster seats are correctly fitted into the vehicle.

A child who is properly secured in an approved, correctly-fitted child car seat is less likely to be injured or killed in a crash.
